Bill Verall was a long time member of HRSA, over many years writing up his experiences repairing and refurbishing a wide range of radios in *Radio Waves*. Following his passing earlier this year, the SA Group has been asked by Bill's family to assist in finding new owners for his collection. Hopefully in a manner by which the new owners will gain as much pleasure and enjoyment as Bill obviously did.

There were too many restored radios to fit into any of our usual HRSA auctions, so arrangements have been made to hold a special auction at Bill's place in February. This will be a special extra HRSA SA Group gathering.

It will include restored radios. Mostly post war, with some very good examples of sets from that era. There are also a number of amateur receivers, together with various items of test equipment. Tablegrams and record turntables also feature.

There are also some interesting "home bru" (Bill's name for them) receivers and kit radios which incorporated Bill's meticulous approach to restoration and his efforts to ensure they performed as they ought. This is evident from reading Bill's contributions in almost every copy of *Radio Waves* between 1995 and 2005.

Valve Bank Update

As the end of the year approaches, we thank Norm Scott and Duncan Macdonald for their sterling effort over this past year in sorting and incorporating the donated valves into the stock database. There are still a lot to be sorted. They are the result of three substantial donations over this past year.

We will take a short break over Christmas and New Year, but apart from that, we are at Aztronics sorting valves every Thursday morning. We are happy to show members what we are doing. Remember members receive a 50% discount on the listed price.

If a wanted valve is not in stock, it may have been recorded as a CV type or other equivalent. We generally record them under the first legible type number on the glass envelope. You can contact me or come and see us on a Thursday morning to ask about equivalents. In our computer listing we include a cross reference for exact equivalents as well as noting other differences (like a different filament voltage, valve base, or envelope, plus CV Equivalents, and different quality variants).

We are looking at recording details on crystals we have been given. With Duncan's special help we are listing frequencies and quantities. While crystals are not needed very often, we feel they are too valuable to throw away, and having a central listed stock might assist members at critical times. Likewise valve sockets and screening cans are also accumulating. They are all available at nominal prices.

Also, I have a large collection of transistors, diodes and integrated circuits per favour of Philips and Codan (life test samples and excess stock resp.). Most are listed, and in my spreadsheet data base. These are available for members. If you need any, or have any questions, please contact me.
